

Statement on future report deadlines in regards to Standard Condition of the Electricity Supply Licence (SLC) 28AA.11

Background

SLC 28AA that came into force on 2 February 2018 implements a price cap to regulate charges for domestic customers who receive the Warm Home Discount (WHD).

This price cap is known as the Relevant Maximum Charge¹ and each period the price cap applies to is known as the Charge Restriction Period. Domestic Suppliers which are subject to the price cap are known as Obligated Licensees.

Under SLC28AA.11 Obligated Licensees must provide the Authority with a report containing specified information about the way their tariffs comply with the price cap. This information must be submitted in a format specified by the Authority and the scope of information includes, by way of example, the name of each tariff, the charges which apply and how many customers are subject to each tariff. The full details of the information which must be provided is set out in SLC 28AA.10.

SLC 28AA.11 provides the first report for these purposes must be submitted to the Authority within five Working Days of the date SLC 28AA came into force, i.e. 2 February 2018. For subsequent reports SLC 28AA.11 provides the Authority with the power to specify the timeframe for submission by publishing a statement in writing.

Submission timeframe for all future 28AA.11 reports

We hereby specify that all reports required under SLC 28AA.11 (other than the first report which was required to be submitted by 9 February 2018), must be submitted to us within 5 working days of the date each Charge Restriction Period begins (commencing with the Charge Restriction Period which begins on 1 April 2018).
