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Ofgem response to comments on our draft guidance, and publication of our final guidance to incorporate changes, on Non-Domestic Renewable Heat Incentive Scheme Closure: Non-Tariff Guarantee Extension Applications

Dear Stakeholder,

On 27 January 2021 Ofgem published draft guidance for comment, in relation to Non-Tariff Guarantee (Non-TG) extension applications under the closure of the Non-Domestic Renewable Heat Incentive (NDRHI) scheme. This for comment period ended on 17 February 2021. The relevant amendment regulations, laid on 25 January 2021, come into force on 1 March 2021.

We're writing to let you know that today we've published our final guidance for NDRHI Non-Tariff Guarantee extension applications, ahead of the opening on 1 March 2021 of the onemonth window for submitting extension applications. The guidance can be found <u>here</u>.

We have reviewed all responses, and where appropriate have updated our guidance. We would like to thank all those who responded and those who attended our workshop on extension applications on 11 February 2021.

The comments and our response

We received comments on our draft guidance from a total of 13 stakeholders. We have used this feedback and comments and questions received at the stakeholder event on 11

February to make changes to the draft document where appropriate. Table 1, below, lists the key changes made.

It is worth reiterating that this was not a consultation on the policy underpinning the NDRHI scheme, from the Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS) at www.gov.uk/beis, but on the clarity of the Ofgem guidance document.

Schedule of changes

Where we have made key changes to the guidance document in response to comments, we provide a reference to the change and section in which the guidance is published. These changes are listed in Table 1, below.

particularly important in a scheme closure

Paragraph now states 'Even in the event of	Chapter 4, 4.12

submitting multiple applications via the	
NDRHI Register.'

confirmation by email. If the extension is	
rejected, the applicant will be notified by	
email. We will confirm the reason(s) for the	
rejection.'

application is granted, applicants must	
commission their eligible NDRHI installation	
and submit a properly made accreditation	
application on or before midnight at the end	
of 31 March 2022 before accreditation may

determined based on the intended	
operational design conditions.'

the extension application and information	
published by BEIS, Ofgem will assess	
whether or not there is available budget to	
progress the application further in the	
application review process, or whether it	
should be held in a queue. Where we are	
operating a budget queue, applications will	
only be held in the queue if they are	
considered properly made and demonstrate	
that the eligibility criteria has been	
satisfied.'
